WORKING WITH SCHOOLS

On a very wet morning in March, pupils from St. Albans R.C. Primary School came to the Cemetery to help plant a hawthorn hedge round a Commonwealth War Graves Commission burial area, close to the Civilian Garden of Remembrance. Fortunately the wet weather did not dampen the spirits of the pupils who set to the task in hand with enthusiasm. The hawthorn whips were purchased via a grant from Veolia Environmental Services. The event was attended by the Lord Mayor and Lady Mayoress, together with representatives from Veolia, the Commonwealth War Graves Commission, New Vision, Bereavement Services and Quadron Contractors. A number of teachers and parents from the school and local residents were also in attendance.

As part of their ECO week in July, pupils from Woodthorpe Junior and Infant School, enjoyed a visit to Brandwood Pool to take part in pond dipping and bug hunting. They were joined by members of Friends of Brandwood End Cemetery and members of Friends of Brandwood Pool who helped supervise the pond dipping. OAK TREE ISLAND

The oak tree on the main drive has long been a cause for concern. This beautiful tree which had been a "signpost" for other areas of the cemetery sadly succumbed to a serious fungal disease which weakened its trunk and made it a danger. Therefore there was no alternative but to fell it. A replacement tree in the same spot would not be suitable as there may be fungal spores in the soil. The stump has now been ground out in readiness for the installation of a World War One Memorial.

CIVILIAN GARDEN OF REMEMBRANCE

Thanks are extended to the brave souls who gave the hawthorn hedge a much needed trim during a very heavy downfall on 19th July. This garden is now looking really good and this is due to the very small number who work on the trimming, weeding and clearing of debris in the flower beds and around the hedge.
