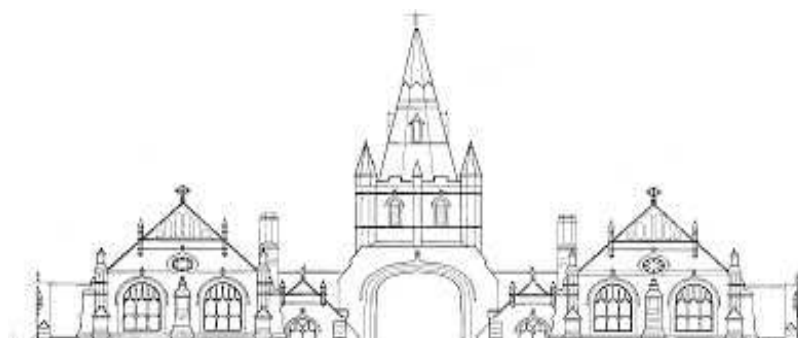

THE CHAPELS

In October 2009 Friends of Brandwood End Cemetery launched a petition entitled “Save Our Chapels” with the aim of getting Birmingham City Council to acknowledge its responsibility for preserving our architectural and cultural heritage and support our efforts to restore these listed Chapels.

Members were out in force on Mothering Sunday as they invited visitors to the Cemetery to sign the petition asking the Council to take action over the deteriorating condition of the two Victorian Terracotta Chapels. People queued on foot and in their vehicles for a chance to sign and express their concern about this ongoing problem. Friends of Brandwood End Cemetery knew that there was local concern, as they formed some 5 years ago following a public meeting on this very subject. Even so they were overwhelmed by the strength of feeling over the neglect of the Chapels. People from all over the country and abroad visit the Cemetery and many are saddened by the sorry state of the buildings in this resting ground where their loved ones are buried. Over 600 people signed the petition in just 3 hours. To date over 1,000 signatures have been collected and it is intended to present the petition to the Council at the end of May. SERVICE OF REMEMBRANCE AND POPPY CROSSES

On Sunday 8th November 2009 at 1.00 p.m. a short Service of Remembrance took place at the Cross of Sacrifice. The Service was conducted by the Rev'd Rosemary Reynolds and wreaths were laid on behalf of the Royal British Legion, Birmingham City Council and Friends of Brandwood End Cemetery. This year we had the good fortune to have a bugler present to play the Last Post. Our thanks to Mr. Bob Johnson, Director of Music, Corps of Drums, Avon Fire Brigade. His contribution greatly enhanced the Service.



Unfortunately, there seemed to be a shortage of Poppy Crosses this year, which meant that we were unable to repeat the Poppy Cross "Cemetery". We did however obtain enough Poppy Crosses to place them on all the War Graves in the Cemetery. We are indebted to the Midlands Co-operative Funeral Service for agreeing to sponsor the purchase of a number of these crosses and to the employees of Wates Construction who placed them on the graves.
